Anglo American – Quadrem Network (QN) to Ariba Network (AN) Transition

As part of our ongoing drive to improve our processes and deliver value across the business, Anglo American Group Supply Chain are committed to implementing electronic procurement technology as a standard platform for conducting business with our Suppliers.

As a Supplier to Anglo American, we wish to remind you that our current preferred method of transacting with Suppliers, for requisition to pay documents and processes, is via the Quadrem Network electronic document exchange solution by SAP Ariba. SAP Ariba has taken a strategic decision to sunset the Quadrem Network and transition all Quadrem Network Customers to the Ariba Network. At the forefront of SAP Ariba's innovation, the Ariba Network provides Buyers and Suppliers with a Network that is easy to use, with a modern User Interface and an efficient overall User Experience, enabling Suppliers to transact with their Customers anywhere, anytime.

We would like to inform you that SAP Ariba remains a strategic partner to Anglo American for our e-Procurement Solutions and the transition to the Ariba Network is fully supported. To this end, an enablement programme for our internal and external stakeholders, including yourselves as our Suppliers, has been initiated. The transition is scheduled to be completed by the end of 2017.

Implementation Approach

This is a global initiative that will be implemented across several Anglo American Business Units and all SAP Ariba Buyer Customers currently transacting on the Quadrem Network. SAP Ariba has established a Supplier Enablement team to support you in the transition and keep you informed of the change as it pertains to Anglo American.
